Background and context

The Australian Council of Deans of Health Sciences (ACDHS) is a forum for representation, coordination and information sharing with the aims of developing a sustainable health workforce that is responsive to evolving system demands and promoting a broad cross-discipline approach to the development of national health policy.

As educators of allied health professionals, ACDHS sits at the nexus between health and education. As such, members are well placed to provide insights on the demands our future health workforce will face, and opportunities to improve the efficacy of their practice and the sustainability of the systems they will work in.

Changing operational environment

Both the education and health sectors are facing challenging operational environments.

- Demand for health professionals is projected to continue to be amongst the highest of any employment sector for the foreseeable future.
- Population growth and structural ageing, increasing chronic disease, the needs, expectations and preferences of the community and persistent workforce shortages in rural and remote Australia are among the many factors influencing this demand.
- Maldistribution of the health workforce continues across geography, sectors and services.

Looking beyond these challenges we maintain our focus at the health system level and on the contributions across professions as we educate our future health workforce to deliver safe, high quality and appropriate health care to the Australian population and nearby economies.
